

praCh was born in the farmland of Cambodia but raised on the mean streets of America. He received international attention with his first album "DALAMA..." "the end'n is just the beginnin". The first Hip-Hop album ever to be # 1 on the Cambodian charts. His highly anticipated follow-up album "DALAMA..." "the lost chapter" catapults his status into raps elites. Through masterful lyrics of powerful rap music, his music educates young and old about the Cambodian genocide and an in-depth look at the life of the Asian American struggles. His music lyrics have been published by Manoa in the book, "In the Shadow of Angkor", which is currently being used for South East Asians studies in colleges and universities. His interview and lyrics was so moving that it generated a spin off. He is now penning his own book to be publish by Manoa. He is also working on a film documentary and has collaborated with many other movies productions. Newsweek proclaimed him as the "Pioneer of Khmer Rap" and "the first Cambodian rap star." He is the CEO of Mujestic Records (www.mujestic.com) and plays a vital role in the Cambodian community. He is the youngest coordinator of the Cambodian New Year celebration for the city of Long Beach (2002).

In 2003, he released "Dalama...the lost chapter," which independently sold over 100,000 copies. He went on a 23 states tour across the United States, in 2004, which started in Long Beach, California and ended in Hawaii. In January 2005 he returned for the first time to his home land of Cambodia, and his extraordinary journey was documented by NHK Japan. Here in the states he is wrapping things up on a documentary "100,000 Dalama" which follows him though his tour and how he went on to selling 100,000 units of his CD. It will be aired on either PBS or HBO. He is currently working on his last Dalama album, "Dalama...Memoirs of the Invisible War". His work has been featured and been written up by Cambodia Daily, Phnom Penh Post, Newsweek, Times Magazine, ABC, CBS, CNN, NBC, FOX, PBS, Press-Telegram, LA Times, Hmong Times, OC Weekly, 562 Magazine, Asia Week, Khmerconnection.com and many more. A highly recognized and respected community figure, praCh resides in Long Beach, California.
